BAPTISMS are celebrated on the third Sunday of each month (except during Lent) at the 12 Noon Mass. Registration forms must be completed at the Parish Office after meeting with one of the Parish Priests. Instructions for the Sacrament of Baptism are held four (4) times per year (January, April, July, October.) Parents and Godparents are expected to attend these preparation sessions. *Attending these classes before the birth of your child is required.*

ALL INSTRUCTIONS ARE HELD ON SATURDAY IN THE TEACHERS RESOURCE ROOM IN THE SCHOOL (ENTER DOOR #2.) ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEGIN AT 9:45AM. All Godparents must be active, weekly communicants in their home Parish and recommended by their Pastor.

PASTORAL CARE FOR THE SICK

Any parishioner unable to attend Mass should contact the rectory to make arrangements to receive the Eucharist at home.

ANOINTING MASS of the sick is held every year. To schedule an individual anointing at home – or in emergencies – call the rectory.

MARRIAGES:

Arrangements should be started at least one year in advance for the necessary preparation. Parish registration of either the Bride or Groom is required.

PARISH REGISTRATION is required of all who wish to consider themselves parishioners of St. Andrew's. Census forms and collection envelopes are available at the Rectory. To avail yourself of Pastoral Services you must be a registered and contributing member. Registration with the parish is necessary in order for us to provide any written documentation of your membership with us, such as a "sponsor certificate" if you wish to be a godparent or sponsor for Confirmation. If you are not sure if you are formally registered at St. Andrew's or if you have any other questions regarding membership call the Rectory.
